Whole School Value Added Analysis

Value added measures compare the performance of BSS students with students nationally, taking into account each student's prior attainment.

The average of a student's KS2 performance is used as the measure of prior attainment when evaluating progress from KS2 to 4. Average KS4 performance is the prior attainment measure when evaluating progress in KS5.

KS2 to KS4

Progress 8 is the headline progress measure. It shows progress across a selected group of GCSE (or equivalent) exams.

A student's A level performance in each subject is measured against a prediction based on that student's average points score across all of their GCSE subjects. If performance is better than the prediction this represents positive value added. VA is expressed in terms of an A level grade so, for example, 0.5 at A level represents each student, on average, scoring half a grade better than predicted.
