Safe Space

Supporting our Boys

In the summer term, I wrote about the rise of 'looksmaxxing', a term used to describe the actions taken to gain an idealised set of physical traits. There has been a significant rise in online content, most of which is targeted at young men. In these posts, online influencers explicitly link their journey to achieving their physical ideals with gaining a perfect life.

While physical fitness, consistent sleep routines and healthy eating all contribute to better overall health, there is a danger that this trend can, instead, cause significant loss of confidence from unrealistic goals or continued internal and external judgement about an individual's physical appearance.

There is also concern raised by some, that this world of 'looksmaxxing' is a gateway into a much more sinister 'manosphere'. It can lead to young people accessing phobic, misogynistic and dangerous ideology. What many articles and documentaries (such as Louis Theroux's 'Inside the Manosphere') reveal is that many of these influencers recognise the hypocrisy in their own content – even going so far as to explain how ashamed their mothers would be at what they are posting. However, the lure of their clickbait content providing an income is too appealing to make them change their posts or stop altogether.

We are very proud of the way our students interact within this community, and are grateful for the many role models our young people have, both within and beyond school. However, it is easy for this content to infiltrate via algorithms designed to provide endless entertainment. We would encourage all parents to continue to talk to our young people about what they are accessing, how to block dangerous, inappropriate or harmful content, and how to build a healthier online life.

In school, we will continue to talk explicitly about online safety, healthy relationships and how to be upstanders.

Brass Band

Huge congratulations to our brass band, who represented the school superbly at Cripps Hall, Northampton, on Sunday 22nd March, at the Music for Youth National festival regionals.

The band was introduced with aplomb by Rhoda Jones, and they performed two contrasting pieces: *Welcome to the Jungle* by Guns 'n' Roses, and Mozart's *Alleluia*, featuring an exquisite soprano solo by Ella Clark.

The feedback was extremely positive, and we have been invited to perform at the Music for Youth finals in July, at the prestigious Birmingham Symphony Hall.

Well done band and thank you to Mr Turnbull for his expert preparation and coaching for this event.

The following are extracts from the adjudicators' feedback:

"Thank you for such a clear and confident introduction. It immediately helped set the scene and drew the audience in. You really hit us with a bang. This was an exciting, attention-grabbing opening that made an immediate impact. The trombones, in particular, were wonderfully assertive, very much "in your face" in the best possible way and the articulation was great. What impressed me most was how well coached the group clearly is in projecting what is on the page out into the audience. You are not simply treating the score as a rough guide: you are really giving it full commitment and making it come alive. I was really struck by how adaptable the ensemble was. You were able to shift genre instantly, as though moving backwards in time 200 odd years to a very different musical language. The accompaniment throughout was highly sympathetic to the soloist. The euphonium was especially well handled, supporting the singer with real sensitivity. The band showed good awareness of phrasing, which is absolutely crucial in this repertoire. A special word for the singer: Superbly done. You brought real authority and poise to the performance."

The joyful atmosphere continued as the Guitar Ensemble performed 'Legend of the Lake' and 'Friendly Star', followed by the delicate textures and bright tones of both the String and Ukulele Ensembles, each offering something unique and uplifting.

We are therefore thrilled to announce that reading groups will be launching in the library, meeting on Wednesday lunchtimes. These groups will be a wonderful opportunity for students to explore great books, share their thoughts, and connect with other readers.

Students who would like to join a reading group are invited to sign up in the library. Places are open to all year groups, so please do encourage your child to get involved — whatever their usual taste in books may be.

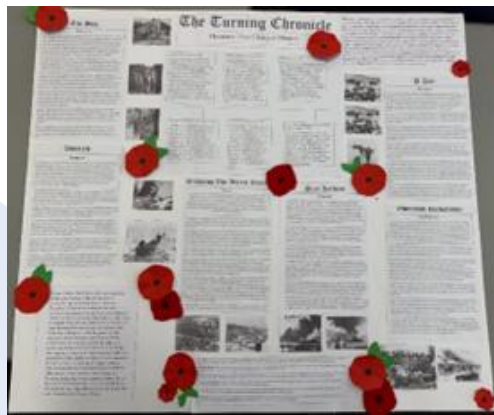


World War Two 'Turning Points'

History Poster Competition

This term, Year 9 historians have been challenged to create a poster answering the question, 'What was the most important turning point of World War Two?' as part of an inter-house competition. We had spent several weeks in lessons investigating a range of significant events during the course of the war, including the Dunkirk evacuation, the Blitz, Operation Barbarossa, Pearl Harbour, D-Day, and the use of atomic bombs in Japan. Students were then encouraged to choose three of these events, as well as any they had researched in addition, to assess the most significant turning point based on agreed criteria.

We were blown away by the quality of work produced by each form group, to the extent that judging students' work was contentious in itself! 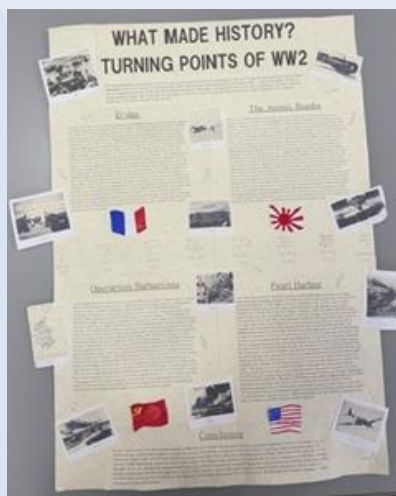
