Commemorating Jane Austen's 250th Anniversary

"It is a truth universally acknowledged..."

— the iconic opening line from *Pride and Prejudice* set the tone for our celebration of Jane Austen's enduring legacy.

This week, we proudly marked the 250th anniversary of one of literature's most influential figures. Renowned for her keen social observations and timeless narratives, Austen remains a cornerstone of English literature and an inspiration for generations of readers.



To honour this milestone, students engaged in a variety of enriching activities. Key Stage 3 students were invited to design postcards featuring a memorable Jane Austen quotation, and Key Stage 4 students were asked to write a reflective essay exploring why Austen is regarded as one of the most distinguished female writers in history. The students' creative responses showcased both literary appreciation and critical thinking. We were also delighted to welcome Louise Verity, a Bishop Alumnus, who kindly joined us to judge the competition entries. On Monday, our library hosted a special screening of *Pride and Prejudice*. The foyer and library were adorned with informative displays highlighting her life, works, and enduring legacy. 
