

Faith

Our Christian foundation and heritage underpin every aspect of school life, creating 'an ethos in which harmonious and respectful relationships enable everyone to flourish' (SIAMS inspection). Inclusive, thought-provoking worship starts each school day. Students of all faiths and those with none are challenged to consider what it means to live in a diverse society where faith is valued and beliefs are respected.

St Matthew's Chapel provides a reflective space at the heart of the school, and the Chaplaincy provides excellent pastoral care to the whole Bishop Stopford community.

We have close links to the Diocese of Peterborough, and with the national Woodard Corporation of schools. Local churches and faith groups support our Chaplaincy by co-planning or leading acts of worship. They also make significant contributions to student-led faith groups and well-being activities - many of which are distinctive to a school with a Christian foundation.

Encouraging Responsibility

Standards of behaviour are extremely high at Bishop Stopford School. We place great value on good manners and appropriate relationships in all aspects of school life. Everyone is expected to exercise self-discipline, and there is a robust emphasis on ensuring that orderliness characterises our day to day interactions.

Our dedicated pastoral team leads on the development of self-discipline. Heads of Year, the Chaplain, form tutors and the Inclusion Team ensure that students are individually nurtured, and that, where necessary, appropriate support is provided to remove any barriers to learning.

We are very sensitive to the challenges of joining a large secondary school. Our transition arrangements are carefully planned to ensure students are effectively supported in making this significant move. From the outset, both the curriculum and pastoral care are designed to encourage students to take responsibility for their learning and to become increasingly self-reliant.

Teaching and Learning Specialists

We strive for excellence across our curriculum so that all students can flourish intellectually.

With a proven track record in delivering strong results at GCSE and A Level, our teaching provides challenge for individuals to develop their skills, knowledge and unique talents with expert support and intervention.

Students are expected to take control of their learning, and are taught how to develop resilience in their studies. They are engaged in high level thinking both in and beyond the classroom – knowing how to challenge themselves as well as being challenged by others in order to grow.

A key belief of ours is that students profit enormously from working together. It is perfectly normal within lessons, in year group activities or through peer mentoring, to see students supporting each other and learning from one other, as they rise to the challenge of achieving their personal best.

Leading in STEM

While academic excellence is seen across our curriculum, we have been at the leading edge of developments in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) for many years. We are a regional STEM hub school, and are actively involved in the training of teachers in the delivery of STEM provision.

As well as developing professional expertise regionally, our aim is also to make students aware of the inter-connectedness of the STEM subjects, nurturing their interest from the time they start at Bishop Stopford School. Through STEM discovery days, we challenge students to work in unique ways to explore the opportunities which are open to them. In addition, our partnership work with employers in the STEM sector enriches our provision.

Uptake of the STEM subjects at A Level is flourishing, as is progression to higher education studies and employment in STEM related subjects.

Excellence in All Things

We develop student leadership through Year and School Councils, Ethos and Digital Ambassadors and the Charity Committee. Community Projects in Year 7, academic societies (managed by sixth form students), and the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme all foster student leadership.

Students are challenged to grow in excellence as they develop personal interests. Aptitudes for film, photography and new technologies are nurtured, as well as those in more conventional fields.

The performing arts are at our cultural heart, with students of all ages encouraged to perform together. Sport is equally important, and students grow in resilience through team and individual pursuits. Those with talents in these areas are encouraged to pursue them - many representing the school and county in their chosen fields. We are very proud of those selected to represent their country or, in the competitive world of the arts, to perform at the highest levels.
