Whilst waiting for my drinks this summer, I held a brief conversation with the young man who was serving me. On discovering that I worked at Bishop Stopford School, his immediate response was, 'Oh, I went there. I flippin' loved that school!' I saw his eyes light up as he asked after a couple of teachers and repeated his appreciation of his time here.

As a viticulturist will know, the nurturing of young vines throughout the various seasons is both labour-intensive and requires great skill and care. The RHS website writes: *Grapevines are fast-growing climbing plants that need plenty of space. They will happily scramble over pergolas or can be trained along horizontal wires attached to sunny walls. To get the best crop, vines need regular attention throughout the growing season, including careful pruning, training and fruit thinning.*

Our young people too are changing and maturing rapidly, seeking the freedoms to develop whilst needing frameworks to provide them with support. They are looking to the outside world, to their families and friends and to teachers and staff, for the attention and the 'careful pruning' and training that they require.

Everything that we do or say will have an impact. How we treat our students, or how they see us treating one another will all be part of the training, teaching and directing that we give, and which they receive.

It was clear to me that the impact for this young man had been precious. There was a fondness and a respect in his voice, which led me to conclude that he too had been treated with both fondness and respect.

Key Stage 4 Study Space

RSE, RE & Worship

Relationships & Sex Education

Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) is delivered to all year groups within the Christian context of Bishop Stopford School. It is an important subject, and we aim to work in partnership with parents to build knowledge, and to establish appropriate attitudes and values surrounding personal relationships, sexual development and behaviour.

RSE consists of three strands:

- the biological aspects of reproduction, taught within Science as a requirement of the National Curriculum.
- social aspects of RSE, which are covered in programmes of Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE), including information about HIV, Aids and other sexually transmitted infections.
- the moral aspects of RSE covered in the RE curriculum, including marriage, contraception, termination and family life.

We liaise closely with specialists in health education throughout the country to construct the programme. The School Nurse Service is involved in both the planning and delivery.

A Parent Guide to Ofsted Inspections

Since our inspection last year, a number of parents have suggested it would be helpful to explain a little more about the framework Ofsted uses to inspect schools. Over the next few weeks, we will update you on the four key areas for inspection:

- Quality of Education
- Behaviour and Attitudes
- Leadership and Management
- Personal Development

Quality of Education

Ofsted inspection teams reach a decision about the Quality of Education which schools provide by focusing on 4 key questions:

- Is the curriculum (ie all that's taught) ambitious and challenging for all students?
- Do teachers teach in a way that helps students to make good progress and remember well?
- Do students perform well in public exams?
- Are students well prepared for the next stage of education, employment or training?

At our school, we respond in these ways:

Curriculum

- All of our students have the full National Curriculum experience for Key Stage 3 for 3 years.
- Our GCSE subjects are available to all students we do not narrow or restrict the curriculum for any students.
- Our curriculum is broad and ambitious for all students.

Teaching

- We are fully staffed with qualified subject specialists.
- We provide comprehensive training to enable teachers to develop their expertise.
- We engage with national research and collaborate locally to enhance the quality of teaching.

Public exam performance

- Over the past 5 years, our academic performance has always been in the top 10% nationally.
- Last year performance placed us in the top 5% nationally; this year looks to be the same.
- All groups of students make great progress: those with Special Needs, disadvantaged, boys, girls, students of all abilities.

Next stage of education, training or employment

- 100% of students at the end of Year 11 and Year 13 progressed into employment, education or training. A growing number have been successful in securing places on high-status apprenticeship programmes.
- All students have access to 1:1 on-demand independent careers advice and guidance.
- Year 13 students regularly attain places at prestigious universities, including Oxford & Cambridge as well
 as places to study very competitive courses such as Medicine, Law and Engineering


Homework tasks are now on Edulink!

This year, homework is set on Edulink rather than Firefly.

Parents can see all the current and past work set, dates and submissions, and students can see the same too. The main difference is that students can add homework themselves in Edulink. To access the homework set, parents and students must log in to the Edulink One app or website with their credentials. Once they have logged in, they need to locate the Homework icon and click it.




Once the Homework window opens, there are two tabs visible at the top. The first tab displays *current* and the second, *past* homework.
