Celebrating Excellence

On Monday 18 December, we will be holding our Celebration of Achievement for students who completed A Levels and GCSEs last summer. We are expecting 600 visitors and look forward to presenting examination certificates and prizes to those who made the most progress in each subject.

It is wonderful to be able to welcome our students – current and former and their families into school to celebrate their many successes in person. We are immensely proud of how hard our students worked to gain the excellent results that they so rightly deserved.

This year, the Progress 8 score (the national method to measure progress made from key stage 2 to key stage 4) means that last year's Year 11 performance places our school 89^{th} – in the top 1.5% of schools nationally.

Former Year 13 students also did amazingly well. While there are no progress measures for them, their average achievement of a grade B outperforms previous success in non-Covid affected years.

But the evening is about far more than academic excellence: it will celebrate the all round excellence of the Bishop Stopford experience, seen, not least in the character and values our young people have developed.

We are delighted our guest speaker is travelling all the way from Dubai for our Celebration of Achievement. Sunil Mashari left us in 2009, and will be joined by Mayor Emily Fedorowycz in presenting certificates and prizes. Both Sunil and Emily are wonderful role models for the evening – both have taken the values from our school and lived them out in different ways.

While the academic achievements of our students are certainly to be celebrated, the evening will be a celebration of the culture of our school and the community to which we all belong and contribute.






