c) Right of Withdrawal

Parents have the right to withdraw their children from all or part of RE and/or Collective Worship. They may also withdraw their children from some or all of Sex Education delivered as part of statutory Relationships and Sex Education. (Parents do not need to give reasons for their request.) Parents do not have the right to withdraw their children from any other curriculum subjects even when they cover aspects of religion, belief or biological aspects of sex as required by the Science curriculum.

If a child is withdrawn for any of the above reasons, the school is still responsible for the supervision of the child. However, this should not incur extra cost to the school. (For example, it is usual for the child to be supervised in a library or with another class of pupils.) The school is not responsible for providing alternative provision, an alternative curriculum or extra work. (For example, a parent cannot ask for extra English or Maths work to be given to their child). No extra marking should take place as a result of withdrawal.
