EXAM ASSESSMENT



Paper 1: Listening, reading and writing.

- 2 hours 30 minutes
- 100 marks
- Listening for gist and details, one question will require a summary
- Reading and responding to stimulus texts (also one summary)
- Translation of at least 100 words from Spanish to English
- Translation of at least 100 words from English to Spanish

Paper 2: Writing

- 2 hours
- 80 marks
- A choice of essay questions to answer
- One essay on each literary text or film.
- Approx 300 words per essay but there is no limit
- No dictionaries or copies of the texts are allowed

Paper 3: Speaking

- 21 - 23 minutes including 5 minutes supervised preparation time.
- Part 1 (5-6 minutes) – discussion of a theme based on a stimulus card (choice of two)
- Part 2 – Individual research project completed by the student. Two minute presentation followed by a 9-10 minute discussion. This research project can be on any topic chosen by the student, linked with any aspect of Hispanic countries or culture.
